

EDITORIAL 171

Welcome to 2024. When you see how many clubs and local organisations are reporting events and activities, it really emphasises how fortunate we are to live in such a lovely Village.

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

If you are reading this then, like me, you have made it to 2024 and so may I wish you a Happy and Prosperous New Year. Let us hope that you all got through the Christmas period without too many traumas.

Since our last issue John Sellick has sadly resigned as a Parish Councillor due to work pressures. We thank you John for all your work and commitment during your time as a councillor. You will be missed. We now have two vacancies for Parish Councillors so please contact the Clerk if you feel that you could help your community by becoming a Councillor.

We have not got much further forward with the new skateboard ramps as although we have submitted all the right forms and got the right permissions the relevant officers at MDDC have not formally approved the S106 application and released the monies they are holding. Our District Councillors have all tried to help but three months have gone by. Our Clerk has again chased the responsible officer and at the time of writing we have just received an e-mail assuring us that it has been approved but advising us not to place the order until we have everything in writing from the Planning Department. We may now have missed our spring slot with the contractor, and we just have to hope that the agreed price will not have gone up.

It has been a bit frustrating for the Parish Council in wanting to make decisions as to works and projects within the village due to lack of feedback or responses from residents on a number of issues. We are going to have to go ahead and then deal with any flack or moans after the event. We have heard nothing back on the grass cutting from residents barring one. We now have to look at what we do for the future of Christmas lights. May I offer thanks to those businesses who supported the 2023/24 light with their generous donations which have been gratefully acknowledged elsewhere.

The Preschool/Nursery are arranging to offer training on CPR and the use of defibrillators within the village. The Parish Council are working with them to try and ensure the right training aids are available to facilitate this initiative which can only benefit our community when someone needs the equipment to save a life. It would be good to have more defibrillators available for emergency use around the village and some of our businesses could contribute by providing and maintaining such equipment on their premises and located in such a way as to make it available to the community 24/7 as PenCarrie has done. If you would like to be involved, please contact David Maynard c/o the Preschool or the Parish Clerk who will pass on your details to the right persons.

We have heard no more as to the possible provision of an initial 170 dwellings off of the back of Muxbeare Lane. There has been no application as yet, but we are aware that exploratory work has been taking place on the site. Please make sure that you respond when given the opportunity.

MDDC are carrying out a survey at the present as to a number of issues toward the updating of the Local Plan so please make time to let your views be known via the online survey. It is all very well having more houses which are needed but they are going to be lived in by people and they need facilities and infrastructure. Roads, utilities, school, doctors, allotments, larger village hall, youth club, allotments, open space for recreation and so the list goes on but gets ignored by the developers and council planners. They just want to build houses to meet targets. You can find details of the survey on the Parish Website so please make the time to complete it.

We will have set the precept by the time you read this, and the detail will be put on the Website for all to see. Hopefully the detail will be included in the next issue of the magazine. It is hoped that the Parish portion of the council tax will only be a few pence per week more than is being paid now as we have cut back as much as possible whilst still taking account of the rising cost of our various contractors. We are still trying to resolve the cost of the safety inspections of the play equipment with MDDC as it is not clear from their finance papers going before Cabinet as I write this. One way of working out their proposed charges would mean an 83% rise, so it is being raised in the hope that someone has got their sums wrong.

Please support the various voluntary groups and others in the village who try and ensure there are activities and interests for all those who need it or want it. May I yet again thank all those who give of their time to make all these things happen. Remember the question is 'How can I help?' – not 'What's in it for me?' Keep well and smiling if you can.

STOP PRESS

Play Area Inspection Charges.

The Chairman of the Parish Council asked questions at the Cabinet Meeting on the 9th of January 2024 concerning the charges proposed by MDDC for the safety inspections of play areas for 2024/25 which would be imposed from the 1st of April 2024 – AFTER we had set the precept and therefore had the potential to put the Parish Council in a position of overspending on the budget. Bear in mind that we would not have known about this had it not been spotted in a table on page 67 of a bundle of meeting papers by an eagle-eyed member of the public.

The explanation for stating that we had paid £2,293.06, which was an error but not admitted, was that the figure was arrived at by doubling the figure for the invoice for the second half of this financial year. Although Chestnut Drive Play Area was added to the second half of the year the other charges were also increased by 16.89%.

The Chairman was advised that the figure for 2024/25 charged for the monthly safety inspections by MDDC would rise to a total of £3,369.60 which will be a rise of 83% over what we had paid for the previous year which had also seen a rise of nearly 17% halfway through the year.

The Parish Council are looking at reducing the number of inspections to avoid such an increase and are in dialogue with our insurers. We could also explore cancelling the lease on some of the play areas which would mean that MDDC would then have to find the costs of maintaining them, but we know that they will not look after them in terms of grass and hedge cutting as well as the Parish does. They could even close them on cost cutting grounds.

A final decision will be made at the February parish council meeting so please let your views be known to the Parish Clerk or your councillors. Make sure our District Councillors know your views as they are apparently quite happy to see rises of 83% imposed upon our community. **Barry G J Warren Chairman Willand Parish Council**.

Despite her not being here very long, she seems to be fitting in wonderfully and all the students are very pleased to have her join our school.

WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

First of all, we would like to thank Geri Holloway for getting in touch in response to our article in the last magazine, with some memories of the works of Albert Coles, better known as Jan Stewer: "I recall being told during my early years at Carr Cottage [in Willand old village] that Albert had once lived in the cottage two doors down from my home. His sojourn there must have been prior to my birth; in my day that cottage was occupied by an elderly Mr and Mrs Bass ... Over the years I have read all his Jan Stewer books, several of them borrowed in my teenage years in Willand from Derek Rowe's parents [at The Elms]. For me, one of the funniest was *Ole Biskit*, all about the author's car. What enormous pleasure Jan Stewer has given to people like me".

The History Group has received an enquiry from a descendent of the Oland/Olande family, who lived in Willand during the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. Unfortunately, apart from the odd mention in the surviving parish registers from that time, we cannot add much information other than to confirm that there is a grave memorial stone in the churchyard dedicated to a Henry Olande, who died in 1586 this being the earliest known burial marked by a memorial at St Mary's.

It was originally inside the church, laid flat on the floor of the north aisle, where Henry Olande's remains are presumably still buried, but the memorial was removed when the floor was resurfaced in 1972, and can now be found outside, in the grassy area to the right of the porch. Due to inevitable weathering, it is becoming more and more difficult to read the inscription: 'Here lyeth the body of Henrye Olande, Clothiere, who dessessed the third day of Apryll in the yeare of our God 1 thousand and 586.'

Henry Olande was a clothier at a time when the internationally important Devon cloth industry was still, just about, in its heyday. One contemporary

commentator, John Hooker, wrote in 1600 that, 'the wool of this county is the best commodity that this county doth field and which keepeth most part of the people in work'. The nearby towns of Tiverton and Cullompton were important centres for local cloth production, and recent research has revealed their significance within Europe-wide trading networks. As a clothier, Henry Olande would have controlled the production of cloth in and around Willand, supplying yarn to the home-based weavers, who usually owned their own looms, and who wove the yarn into cloth, returning the cloth to the clothier in return for the appropriate payment the cloth was then taken away to be dyed and finished. Although we do not know where he lived, we know that Henry Olande was living in Willand in 1581, because he is listed in the Lay Subsidy of that year, a national tax assessment on property owned, being either for land or 'goods'. Henry Olande was assessed on 'goods', probably material and items connected to his work as a clothier, and he was reasonably wealthy; in Willand, only the landowner William Binford was taxed more.

We also have a copy of Henry Olande's will, the original of which is in the National Archives, and this may well shed more light on his business and personal circumstances, but frustratingly it is written in difficult sixteenth century script, which is beyond our current skill-set, and so we have yet to complete a satisfactory transcription if there is anyone of you who can read secretary hand, we'd love to hear from you. The descendent who made this enquiry, Mr Dennis Oland, notes that the Olands had connections with other local parishes, including Uffculme, Culmstock and Halberton, before that branch of the family moved to Somerset, and then onwards to Canada in the 1860s adding to the worldwide Willand Diaspora.

Finally, we recently came across a short report in the local press from 130 years ago, in February 1894, on a talk given by a visiting vicar, extolling to the men of Willand the benefits of giving up alcohol and becoming teetotal: 'Strong Men and Strong Drink' was the subject of a temperance lecture given at the new schoolroom on Thursday evening by Rev. C.J. Valpy French, vicar of Escot. The rough inclement weather prevented a large attendance.' (Or perhaps they were all down the pub?)
