ST MARY'S CHURCH MY YOKE IS EASY, AND MY BURDEN IS LIGHT

When someone registers an account with the social media platform X (formally Twitter) they are asked to give a brief description of themselves. Some examples are very straight forward like Roger Federer who simply says, "professional tennis player". Some people go for a more inspirational approach like Usain Bolt who declares "Anything is possible, I don't think limits." Others are a bit more off the wall, like the American actress Kaley Cuoco who states, "in my next life I want to come back as one of my dogs. They live nicely". If you had to describe who you are in one sentence, I wonder what you would say.

In the Bible, in Matthew 11:29, Jesus describes himself in one sentence. He says, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." In 1st century, Near Eastern language, the heart represented the centre of a person. Jesus is therefore saying that at the very core of who he is, he is gentle and humble. Jesus' yoke is his teaching and the way that of life that he calls people to join, by leaving behind what's not important, or even damaging, and walking with him. In the farming world of the day, a yoke was the wooden crosspiece that connects two animals to a plough. The farmer would choose an older and stronger ox and yoke it with a younger inexperienced animal. The older ox would take most of the weight and the younger one would be free to learn the new way of life. For Christians, Jesus is like that older ox, in that he takes our burdens upon himself and shares his life with us. In the 3rd verse of the famous hymn, How Great Thou Art, Carl Boberg wrote

And when I think that God, His Son not sparing. sent him to die, I scarce can take it in. that on a cross my burden gladly bearing, He bled and died to take away my sin

This month, in our churches, we will be celebrating the great event that this Hymn speaks about so eloquently. On Good Friday we will remember the cross where Jesus died, taking the burden of all the world's brokenness; all the things that stop us from being fully alive and fully human upon himself and died to take away its stifling hold. On Easter Sunday we will celebrate the resurrection and the new existence into which he invites us to step; where freedom from those burdens is a reality and the new way of Christ's teaching proves to be light and life giving. If you are around over Easter, please do come and join us in St Mary's as we celebrate this wonderful event and seek to encounter the one who is humble and gentle in heart. **Rev Ben Maynard**

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

The year is moving on at pace and by the time you read this Spring should have sprung. Having said that it seems too cold to plant seeds and so I do not know how our allotment holders will be progressing. What I do know is that I planted broad beans in the autumn, and they were doing well but the continued frosts have won the battle, and they will be no good now.

All the improvements planned for the play areas are in place and the Orchard Way area seems to have become very popular. Please look after it. Having said that we are getting reports of youngsters – little ones – riding what looks like small motor or electric bikes around the Jubilee Field. Please do not do it. They will not be insured and so there would be a problem if they hit someone or caused damage. It does not help the grass surface either. Parents – please.

The referendum for the adoption of the village Neighbourhood plan has been held and will be adopted at MDDC Full Council meeting in April. Sadly, only about 10% of the possible electorate voted which is rather sad because from what I saw it was mainly older people who voted but it is the future of the younger members of our community that will be affected.


You will no doubt have seen various press reports dealing with the Government wish to do away with our local councils and have much larger areas run by elected Mayors. I have not seen anything that indicates what will happen to Town or Parish Councils or who or what will look after our local assets like the play areas, allotments and cemetery. What will happen to any reserves that are being built up to maintain and run these facilities or to provide replacement equipment when the current kit is no longer serviceable?

The volunteers from the M5 workers certainly improved the width of the footpath out to the garage but unfortunately they did not get the time to finish it. Devon County Highways can now see what needs doing to finish the job and then there are sections of the surface which needs putting right. Not holding my breath and I hope that no one trips over or injures themselves and then sues the council. Being a cynic, they would probably spend our money on lawyers trying to get out of paying any compensation and that would cost more than it would to put things right in the first place. On a positive I have noticed that the potholes in Orchard Way have been filled.

The annual village meeting was held on the 13th of March 2025 and reports submitted by the various organisations within the village, together with the minutes, will be available on the website.

Please support all of the various organisations within the village and do not be afraid to offer to help. Remember my regular saying, The question is 'How can I help' NOT 'What's in it for me? **Barry G J Warren Chairman**

OPENING TIMES The site is open on **Wednesdays** and **Sundays**, 10.00am – 12 noon. *From Monday 28th April we will be adding our seasonal evening opening each Monday from 6.30 – 7.30pm.*

WE ACCEPT Green Garden waste, such as fresh grass (please keep this separate) & hedge clippings, pruning's that can be cut with secateurs up to 1 inch diameter. Also, flowers, vegetables & plants. PLEASE ENSURE ALL LABELS, STONES, EXCESS SOIL HAS BEEN REMOVED BEFORE DONATING YOUR GREEN WASTE FOR COMPOSTING.

LEAVES We gratefully receive leaves, which must be clean and free from stones/other objects please.

WE DON'T ACCEPT Cordyline and Palm leaves as they can block or damage the shredding machine.

COMPOST TO BUY Sieved compost (with next to no twigs) costs \pounds 2.50 per bag. Un-sieved waste costs \pounds 2.50 per wheelbarrow. If required, we have a wheelbarrow for you to use – just ask.

DISTRICT OFFICER FOR MID DEVON DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Hi Willand Residents, my name is Andrew, and I am a District Officer for Mid Devon District Council. One of our roles is to ensure dogs are kept on a lead in areas that are covered by a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) as well as dealing with dog fouling issues. Being a Willand resident myself, visually and through complaints, I have seen a big increase in dog fouling issues and people not adhering to keeping their dogs on a lead in Jubilee Fields.

Notable areas where dog fouling has increased include Gables Road, Jaycroft and the church footpath. Dog fouling is not only unpleasant, but it is DANGEROUS. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause Toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

Jubilee Fields is an area where dogs are to be kept on a lead at all times, the enclosed play area is a No Dogs allowed area. As a dog owner myself I understand that residents find it hard to find places to have a dog off the lead, however, Jubilee Fields has a PSPO to ensure that dogs are kept under proper control, as well as to tackle dog fouling, especially as this area is very well used by children.

Our District Officers will be carrying out extra patrols over the coming months. If anybody is seen to be in breach of a PSPO or if we spot anybody that has not cleared up after their dog you could be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of $\pounds 100$ (reduced to $\pounds 50$ if paid within 14 days of the notice), or face court action which could result in a conviction and a fine of up to $\pounds 1000$.





Our AGM that is to be held on 23rd May at 7pm again in the village hall. All are welcome.



WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

First of all, we would like to invite you all to our Willand Archive Open Morning on Saturday, 31 May 2025, running from 10am to 12 noon, in The Annex of Willand Village Hall (the room nearest the Youth Club, towards the end of the car park). Everyone is welcome to drop in for a few minutes for a quick look, or to linger as long as you like – and there will be teas, coffees and biscuits! We will have on display a wide selection of items, from original documents and artefacts, including some of the many pictures we have of bygone Willand, to research collections and other resources, showing what we have collected on behalf of the parish, and what has been kindly donated to the Archive over the past 25 years. For example, we will have our (almost complete) collection of Willand Parish Magazines out to celebrate what will be the magazine's 30th anniversary this November.

It will be the launch of our Willand Buildings Project (we've yet to think of a snappy name for it – any ideas?), through which we hope to trace the history of all buildings in the parish – from businesses and public halls to residential homes – including those that are no longer here. We hope to create a timeline of changes right up to the latest housing developments. We will have on display some of the records that we will be using, such as old maps, property legal documents, census returns and other records tracing who lived where in Willand over the last 200 years or so. So please do come along if you would like to know about the history of your house, or the people who lived there. We are more than happy to assist, if we can. Or if you have any queries or there's anything you would like to know about the history of Willand or would like to know more about the History Group and what we do, please drop by. We also invite you to bring along anything connected to Willand's past that you think might be of interest, whether that be documents or photos, memories or information – we would love to see you there!

The report of a somewhat tragic incident of national significance, which took place early in the Second World War and was connected to a Willand house, has recently been rediscovered in the Archive. It concerns Rydon House, located between the ESSO garage and the M5 motorway bridge to the south of the parish. This property is famously known as 'the house that moved' - socalled because it was deconstructed to make way for the motorway in the early-1970s and rebuilt, exactly the same, in its current location. The story relates to Eric Batten, who had lived at Rydon House since his marriage, in 1934, to Beata Maunder who the daughter of local farmer and entrepreneur, Edwin Maunder (brother to Lloyd Maunder, founder of the meat processing business now owned by 2 Sisters). Eric Batten served throughout the war as an officer in the Somerset Light Infantry, ending up with the rank of Captain. In September 1940 an article appeared in the local press under the headline 'Willand Officer Captures a Spy' and reported: "The following extremely interesting letter was received; In connection with the recent case published in the daily papers, in which two German spies were hung at Pentonville Prison, Sec.-Lieut. Eric A.



The trial took place in secret and no members of the public were admitted. Mr Batten disarmed the spy, whom he captured at 4am, and handed him over to headquarters. He later found the transmitting [radio] set near where the spy had been hiding."




