

EDITORIAL 179

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

I am at an age now where one is inclined to have many moments of reflection of the past and sometimes struggling in remembering what you did yesterday. Having said that, how many of us will admit to going upstairs and then having to go downstairs again to try and remember why you went upstairs in the first place. Not so painful for me now that I have the stair lift, but it does push the electricity bill up.

As I write this I am mindful that the target date for submission of this article is a day before the Annual Parish Council Meeting when the first item on the agenda is the election of Chairman for the next year and that is followed by the election of the Vice Chairman. We will have to ask the Magazine Editor to hold a small slot for 'Stop Press' with the result. Will the majority of the Parish Councillors wish me to carry on as Chairman or will they feel that it is time for a change. I am not as mobile as I was, but the brain still works, and it retains a considerable amount of 'corporate knowledge' which has been called upon many times when there has been a new Parish Clerk come into post. My computer helps out at times. This may be my last effort for the magazine, and some may consider that a relief!

I think I was coopted onto the Parish Council during 2011. I have never been elected as there has never been sufficient candidates coming forward to have to hold an election. We still have one vacancy on the Parish Council at present. I was elected Chairman in 2015 and the only current person who has served as a Parish Councillor longer than me is our Vice Chairman, Richard Phare. I have even been an Independent District Councillor for the area of Lower Culm for four years during that time which brought more knowledge of local authority working to the fore.

One thing we all learn as Councillors is if you please some you upset others. The bulk of people are quite content to take little or no interest at all until it really affects them personally. We do suffer from time to time with comments on social media, many of which result from misinformation or a lack of factual understanding. Few people come to Parish Council meetings. Some expect much from the Parish Councillors forgetting we are all 'volunteers' trying to do something for our community. There are other volunteers who look after the village hall, work to keep our churches and various clubs going and those that just help a neighbour. None get paid and invariably it costs them money.

No one should not know what is going on in the Parish if they are the least bit interested. There is this magazine, all run by volunteers [thank you] and it is delivered free to all households. Some admit to never reading it but will still moan that they do not know what is going on. There is the Parish Council Website and Facebook pages and then the three notice boards. If you need to know anything you can always contact the Parish Clerk or one of the Councillors. All the papers in respect of items discussed at Parish Council meetings are available on the website.

The Parish Council can always be expected to do more by some, but it is very encouraging when I get the odd call from someone outside of the village complimenting us on the state of the village as opposed to where they live.

Let us reflect on what has been achieved over the past 14 years or so, bearing in mind there are many things that come under the jurisdiction of the District or County Councils which we can do little or nothing about.

Our roadside verges are regularly cut by a contractor appointed by the Parish Council. Some finance comes from Devon County Council, but they will only cut visibility splays. MDDC used to cut them on contract for DCC, but it has been found that the Parish get them cut to a better standard and more often. We do leave some wildlife areas where we can but always try and make sure that a margin by the roadside is cut regularly to enable dog walkers to 'pick up' after their charges.

We have our own cemetery which has been extended looking to the future. The boundary has been 'hedged' with wildlife friendly planting, some trees have been placed, and an area has been seeded to be a 'wildlife meadow' until needed for burials. An area is also being made available for the scattering of ashes for those who do not wish a lasting memorial. Extra seating has been provided.

There are nine play areas and a number of other smaller open spaces in the village. The Jubilee Field is owned by the Parish, but the Gables Lea end is leased from MDDC. Five other play areas are leased from MDDC. The grass and hedges are cut by contractors for the Parish and grass is cut 15 times a year in the larger areas of Jubilee Field and Orchard Way and 9 times a year in the smaller play areas – MDDC controlled areas are cut less often. Chestnut Drive play area has been completely refurbished recently. Considerable extra equipment has been made available in Orchard Way area which has resulted in considerably more people using this area. The Jubilee Field has had much equipment added and some replaced. The Pump Track has been a great addition over the past years and is very popular with all age groups – even from outside of the area. Please can we stop the children throwing the stones from the track drainage points around the field. It costs money to replace them apart from the potential damage to the mowing machines or causing injury to people who may fall on them.

Do not forget the provision of the Air Ambulance night landing site. The Scouts have also painted the fence by Gables Court as part of their community work – thank you.

Working with the Village Hall Trustees new CCTV has been installed to aid safety/security and any police or Council enquiries. Most of the Jubilee Field is also covered and the cameras have recorded a couple of serious assault and robbery incidents recently. Hopefully the police will use the evidence and take some positive action as we do not want such incidents in our community. Please remember to report all incidents to the police as they need to have a full picture on which to plan action.

The Neighbourhood Plan has been prepared and fully approved and adopted by MDDC and a Parish Group will be formed to oversee and move things forward for the benefit of the village. We have our VAS machine checking speeds within the village and there is a working group formed with adjoining villages to look at road safety issues. One Councillor is working toward reforming the Speedwatch Group within the village, but he needs more support from volunteers please.

We still have no idea as yet as to what the Government proposals for reorganisation of Local Government will mean for Parish Councils but hopefully we are doing the best we can to be prepared for any eventuality by having up to date policies and procedures which will be fit for purpose. We also have a comprehensive Asset Register which can be viewed on the website. On a personal note, I bet it will cost we, the public, a lot of money whatever they do!

Volunteers are preparing to receive new plants for the planters around the village and we hope that we will have a good show again. Thank you to our volunteers.

Please do all you can to support and enjoy living in our community and do not be afraid to offer to help as I am sure someone will be only too pleased to receive your help. **Barry G J Warren.**



We are still experiencing a very high volume of bookings, which means the Hall is in use almost every day of the year. We are continuing to improve our facilities in order to maintain the high standards our users expect.

We have had a few problems recently with our dishwasher not being used properly and with dishes left in it after use. The programme is only a few minutes long, so you do need to wait a long time before dishes are clean. It is important that the machine is emptied after use as well. If you are not sure how to operate it, please mention it on your booking form and we can arrange a demonstration. There have also been complaints about incorrect use of the PA /stage lighting system. This is a very expensive piece of equipment, so please ask for instruction before you use it.

We have now repaired and repainted the front of the stage in the Main Hall and also made the under-stage area safer and more accessible.

We still have a few vacancies on the trustee board for the Hall. If any of you are interested, please contact Michael at **chairman@willandvillagehall.org.uk**. There are only 6 meetings a year and they are very short (usually less than an hour). The Hall is a vital part of Willand Community, and we need trustees to help run it efficiently.

Because of the increasing costs of fuel, wages and repairs / maintenance, we will be increasing our hire charges from 1st April 2025. Below is a list of the new rates. We will also be asking for full payment in advance if a hire charge is less than $\pounds 40$. This will save a lot of admin work, which happens with the present $\pounds 30$ deposit, which means an additional invoice has to be raised for just a few pounds.

Are we in a Meaning Crisis

I wonder how often you step back to consider some of the big questions of life. Things like, 'why am I here?' 'What is the purpose of my life?' and 'what happens to me when I die?' Back in 2002 there was an Xbox advert showing a human hurtling through life at breakneck speed with no time to reflect or think about what's going on before they met their inevitable end. The ad finishes with the words, 'life is short, play more!' Whilst I'm all for computer games and enjoying other leisure activities, thankfully life is not as short as the advert suggests and we do have time to consider the bigger questions. This is something we have been doing in our churches over the last month.

One of the questions that has so far evaded the scope of science is the origin of the universe. Yes, we are pretty sure that there was a big bang but what there was before that is in the realm of faith or guesswork. The Bible has a compelling picture of what existed in the nothingness before the universe was propelled into existence. In the Gospel of John (17:24) Jesus prays "Father, you loved me before the creation of the world". Therefore, before anything came into existence, there was love. Perfect love that existed between the Father, Son and Spirit. The upshot of this is that the creative force which brought everything into being is love. Dr Martin Luther King stated, "love is the greatest force in the universe."

There are many people and experts who have noted that we in the west have entered a meaning crisis characterised by feelings of disconnect and purposelessness. No doubt there are lots of reasons for this, but the erosion of belief in God is seen as a contributing factor. The world's most famous atheist-Richard Dawkins- said this, "The universe we observe has precisely the properties we should expect if there is, at bottom, no design, no purpose, no evil and no good, nothing but blind pitiless indifference." If this sort of statement doesn't propel the reader into a meaning crisis, I don't know what would!

Richard Dawkins is a great scientist, but I want to side with Jesus and Martin Luther King on this issue. Love is the greatest force in the universe and its existence tells us something about who we are. We were made for relationship. Relationships with one another and most importantly a relationship with God. LIBRARIES UNLIMITED LAUNCHES THE SUMMER BOOK QUEST FOR KIDS

Children across Devon are going to be able to take a Deep-Sea Adventure at their local library this summer as Libraries Unlimited launch their very own

reading challenge. Based on the charity's popular reading challenge for five to twelve-year-olds 'The Secret Book Quest', The Summer Book Quest sees beloved characters Pip, Zena and Libro head off on a new adventure. The theme for the first year is The Deep-Sea Adventure, based on the Underwater Zone in The Secret Book Quest.

The aim with creating this unique quest, is to engage as many children as possible in reading over the summer holidays and making it fun and engaging. To

complete the quest, children are challenged to do three things: visit the library, read what they love and complete one or more of The Summer Book Quest activities. Each completed task gives them a sticker and once they have them all they get a finisher sticker, keyring and certificate.

Activities are tied into the theme of The Deep-Sea Adventure and offer lots of choices including 'draw a sea creature, real or imagined' try a water activity like swimming or rock pooling' and 'tell a member of staff an underwater fact. To be more inclusive, children can now count how often they read for ten minutes or more or count how many books they read - they choose.

Devon children's author Dan Metcalf was commissioned to create the story which introduces new characters including ninja starfish. And Emily Fox, who created the illustrations for The Secret Book Quest and Libros Friends, has done the illustrations.

Libraries Unlimited have linked up with Active Devon, Surfers Against Sewage and Surfing England for The Summer Book Quest. Surfing England will be sharing the information with their surf clubs across the county and providing prizes. Surfers Against Sewage are providing activity resources to libraries including access to their online Ocean School, they're also providing prizes. Active Devon is supporting by promoting the challenge and encouraging families to visit their local community pools. Libraries across Devon are also teaming up with their local sports centers, including Mid Devon Leisure and Fusion Lifestyle, to offer free or discounted swim sessions as part of The Summer Book Quest, encouraging families to get active and enjoy time together as part of the challenge.

It has been proven that reading for pleasure is more important for children's cognitive development than their parents' level of education and is a more powerful factor in life achievement than socio-economic background. Reading for pleasure develops vital literacy skills, empathy, increased confidence and well-being too. As Devon is a coastal county, the underwater theme allows connection with our communities, and we can promote the importance of

looking after our oceans and planet. More than anything, we are trying to make it fun and inclusive. Who doesn't love a ninja starfish?"

The Summer Book Quest will be launched on 12th July and is available until 6th September. It's completely free to join the library and take

WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

First of all, we would like to invite you all to our Willand Archive Open Morning on Saturday, 31 May 2025, running from 10am to 12 noon, in The Annex of Willand Village Hall (the room nearest the Youth Club, towards the end of the car park). Everyone is welcome to drop in for a few minutes for a quick look, or to linger as long as you like – and there will be teas, coffees and biscuits! We will have on display a wide selection of items, from original documents and artefacts, including some of the many pictures we have of bygone Willand, to research collections and other resources, showing what we have collected on behalf of the parish, and what has been kindly donated to the Archive over the past 25 years. For example, we will have our (almost complete) collection of Willand Parish Magazines out to celebrate what will be the magazine's 30th anniversary this November.

It will be the launch of our Willand Buildings Project (we've yet to think of a snappy name for it – any ideas?), through which we hope to trace the history of all buildings in the parish – from businesses and public halls to residential homes – including those that are no longer here. We hope to create a timeline of changes right up to the latest housing developments. We will have on display some of the records that we will be using, such as old maps, property legal documents, census returns and other records tracing who lived where in Willand over the last 200 years or so. So please do come along if you would like to know about the history of your house, or the people who lived there. We are more than happy to assist, if we can. Or if you have any queries or there's anything you would like to know about the history of Willand or would like to know more about the History Group and what we do, please drop by. We also invite you to bring along anything connected to Willand's past that you think might be of interest, whether that be documents or photos, memories or information – we would love to see you there!

The report of a somewhat tragic incident of national significance, which took place early in the Second World War and was connected to a Willand house, has recently been rediscovered in the Archive. It concerns Rydon House, located between the ESSO garage and the M5 motorway bridge to the south of the parish. This property is famously known as 'the house that moved' – so-called because it was deconstructed to make way for the motorway in the early-

1970s and rebuilt, exactly the same, in its current location. The story relates to Eric Batten, who had lived at Rydon House since his marriage, in 1934, to Beata Maunder who the daughter of local farmer and entrepreneur, Edwin Maunder (brother to Lloyd Maunder, founder of the meat processing business now owned by 2 Sisters). Eric Batten served throughout the war as an officer in the Somerset Light Infantry, ending up with the rank of Captain. In September 1940 an article appeared in the local press under the headline 'Willand Officer Captures a Spy' and reported: "The following extremely interesting letter was received; In connection with the recent case published in the daily papers, in which two German spies were hung at Pentonville Prison, Sec.-Lieut. Eric A. Batten, of a battalion of the Somerset Light Infantry (whose home is at Rydon House, Willand), was responsible for the capture of one of the spies and was the chief witness during their trial at the Old Bailey. The trial took place in secret and no members of the public were admitted. Mr Batten disarmed the spy, whom he captured at 4am, and handed him over to headquarters. He later found the transmitting [radio] set near where the spy had been hiding."

The History Group will be meeting to discuss and plan forthcoming projects and ongoing research on Tuesday, 29 April 2024, at 7pm, in The Annex of Willand Village Hall – anyone with an interest in local history is welcome.


