I Hope you all enjoyed Halloween. Also, Remembrance Day. The next celebration is of course Christmas. The volunteer staff at your Parish Magazine wish all our readers a Very **Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.**



PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

The year of 2025 is fast moving toward the end of the year and on a personal note there has been a large milestone for me personally during the year in that the wife and I celebrated our Diamond Wedding Anniversary [60 years married for you youngsters]. Those of the family that were available on the day went with us to 'the scene of the crime' at the church at Widecombe-in-the-Moor. Photographs were taken and so we now have 'before and after' records. Sadly, it was also a time of reflection for us as my Best Man is now buried in the churchyard and the wife's Matron of Honour, and two bridesmaids are no longer with us although still remembered.

On the subject of remembering, I had the honour to again represent our community in laying the wreath on the war memorial in the churchyard at the remembrance service. I was supported by our Vice Chairman, and I mean supported, as the aged legs are not as reliable as they were. The weather was kind and we had no rain during the service and it was very pleasing to see so many people there. I saw at least one-person in-service uniform and many veterans with medals proudly displayed. The event was well supported by our young people from the Scouts, Guides and their younger organisations. Thank you all for attending and supporting this act of remembrance.

Speaking of the Scouts may I say a big thank you to them and their supporters for volunteering to paint the fence in the Jubilee Field at the Gables Lea end over the summer. Great job done.

Regrettably there is still an amount of Criminal Damage being committed within the village and I have had concerned residents contacting me as other than the police giving the victims a crime number, no other action appears to have been taken. Regrettably the Parish Council found it necessary to send a letter of complaint to the Chief Constable, with a copy to the Police and Crime Commissioner, as to the failure of the police to make enquiries into a number of complaints made to them. The PCC's Office responded with a 'sloped shoulders' response and passed it onto the Police Professional Standards Department of the police. I had to laugh as it said that the PCC did not become involved in 'operational matters'.

I knew that she had been the subject of complaints as to her interference in operational matters made against her by a number of retired officers, many of them had held senior ranks including a former Chief Constable. Before anyone asks – no I was not one of them. Incidentally the complaints were dealt with by the PCC's own Chief Executive! The complaint from the Parish Council did receive press coverage and an Inspector gave a response to the press. Other than an acknowledgement of receipt of the complaint from the Professional Standards Department your Parish Council has heard nothing at the time of writing. The Inspector does not appear to communicate with representatives of your community.

The Anaerobic Digester plant which was Willand Biogas has been purchased by a new company and they are in the process of tidying up the site. It will be known as Devon Green Power and their PR Company has been in touch with me to arrange a meeting so that the Parish Council can be briefed as to what is proposed for the site and they wish to hear of any concerns and problems. More on this in the future but rest assured I shall be asking some very pointed questions. Watch this space and the website for updates.

On the subject of information, I hope that you have all seen the survey and responded to Mid Devon District Council as they seek to hear the views of residents in order to plan for the future and this will also aid future budget setting. Your own views and wishes may not be taken into account but if you do not have your say it is no good moaning about the outcome.

Whilst on the subject of surveys – thank you to those who responded to our request for opinion as to whether or not the Parish Council should continue weed spraying of the pavement edges and pavioured areas of road surface. Primarily due to the odd weather patterns it was not so effective this past year. The Parish Clerk put together a report for the Parish Council meeting in November and it is available to read on the website. Any decision made will be able to be seen in the minutes of the meeting and apart from being on the website the minutes are displayed on the noticeboards around the village.

After long and loyal service John Holmes, our litter picker has retired, and we have been grateful for Graham filling in. By the time you read this our new man, Paul Bright, will have started work and we hope that you will make him as welcome as you did John. Thank you John for all your service to the village and please have a long and happy retirement but do not be a stranger.

The Parish Council now has three vacancies as Sue Leach has had to give up due to a change in personal circumstances. Thank you Sue for your contribution to the Parish Council and we still see your contributions to various activities around the village. We remember you every time we look at the Post Office window. If anyone can help by becoming a Councillor please contact the Parish Clerk for more information. You will be made very welcome.

Planning applications are coming to the Parish Council for comment. Remember we are only consultees we cannot make the final decision. It is the time of year when many applications are received wanting to do work on trees which are the subject of Tree Protection orders. One real problem for us is the lack of information from the applicants as to the reasons for the need for works. "I just want to cut a branch off because it is shading my garden" does not help, the tree was probably there first before the house was even built. Now I am going to be in trouble with some no doubt.

A request has been received to comment on an application to vary conditions and drawings for the modular homes which have been built in Somerlea. They are changing the parking and landscaping layout to allow rear access to the already established houses which have been purchased by the residents.

This issue was raised in the Parish Council responses to this planning application but was ignored by the planning officers and eventually the planning committee.

We had also considered that it was over development by trying to put so many houses on this site and the parking problems on the roads around would be an issue as more than 20 parking spaces are lost. You can now see what it will look like. I have had them described to me as a 'pile of portacabins'. I cannot use some of the other comments made. I am sure that those who are allocated them will be pleased to have a roof over their heads. Any aggravation or discussions over parking will be another story.

On behalf of the Parish Council and affected residents, I submitted a complaint to MDDC for breaches of the planning conditions and officer failings when discharging required planning conditions. Contrary to the Complaints Policy at MDDC the officer dealing with the complaint was the one that was the subject of the complaint. A complaint about that was met with a response requiring sympathy and understanding regarding staffing levels and management availability but at least they did not use Covid as an excuse this time. A friend of mine looked at the responses received and said "MDDC are getting better at finding 'inventive explanations' for why they are not doing their job properly."

The Parish Council have put forward a suggestion that the adverse parking position could be helped by providing parking spaces on the grass verges as they did in Fir Close when they built on the carpark. The suggestion was detailed and in writing with maps and photographs and shared with our three District Councillors. The Head of Housing has basically ruled it out with the usual wordy meaningless response but has said he would discuss with the Cabinet Member responsible but we have heard nothing more. We are still trying. Any of those residents being affected could help by writing of their difficulties to the MDDC Ward Councillors who appear to be silent on the matter.

The Parish Council has also been consulted on a planning application for outline and access to build up to 130 dwellings on the field between the current site of Foxmill Gardens and the Esso Garage.

The details have been on the website and I hope that people have let their views be known. The Parish Council response will be on the website and although you may see it after the closing date do not be put off from sending in your views. There are already 45 documents to read on the site at the time of writing and I expect that there will be many more. What the document about an application at Helston has to do with it I do not know. They say they are to meet the housing need within the village really. They have already built over a 100 more houses than the current Local Plan stated for Willand and we have had no increase in facilities. If they get the outline permission then the Reserved Matters application, with all the final detail, will follow.

A long report this time but hopefully it will answer some of the people who feel the need to ask, 'What are the Parish Council doing about it?'

By the time you read this hopefully our volunteers will have planted up the planters around the village. The Old Well Garden Centre has provided the plants with a generous discount again and so I hope we support them in return.

Thank you to all involved. I spend too much time at the garden centre drinking coffee and eating cake or having lunch.

Christmas is coming and there are lots of events being arranged in and around the village. Please support all you can as that is what makes us a community that so many appreciate. Please do not forget to keep an eye on any neighbours who are on their own and would appreciate some help and attention. We have to bear in mind that some really cherish their privacy and so we have to be careful not to impose ourselves where not wanted.

May I finish my thanking all my Colleagues on the Parish Council for their help and support in trying to make the right decisions for the benefit of our community. Thank you to all the volunteers and organisers who also make our community what it is. May I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy and Prosperous New Year. **Barry G J Warren Chairman**



WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

Firstly, we would like to congratulate Willand Parish Magazine on its 30th anniversary, and thank all those involved, past and present, for the huge amount of time and effort it takes to bringing this magazine to the parish. Long may it continue to be one of, if not *the* best parish magazines around.

Secondly, we have an appeal for information, as we are trying to track down the family of a former Willand resident, Frank Clarke, who lived in one of the bungalows opposite the ESSO garage until his death in 2010. He had written an unpublished booklet called 'The Rookie Platoon' containing his memories of serving in the 2nd Battalion of the Gloucestershire Regiment through the Second World War. Frank rose through the ranks from raw recruit to officer, commissioned in the field, and served through the invasion of Europe from D-Day until December 1944, when he stepped on a landmine in the lowlands of the Netherlands, losing a leg. Frank had passed on a copy of this booklet to Brian Holmes, former editor of the parish magazine, who would like to reunite it with one of Frank's family. We know that Frank had two daughters and one son and believe that they are still living in the Tiverton area, if you know them, or have any information on how we could contact them, please do get in touch.

With our world still so afflicted by war, it is worth reflecting on the experiences of people like Frank at a time when conflict raged much closer to home. Frank gives a flavour of the heightened emotions as he describes leading his platoon of Glosters in the liberation of Normandy: "Pushing on into [the French town of

Bayeux, the small number of Germans left to hinder us were soon accounted for. Keeping the French from the German prisoners was almost impossible. Not until they were threatened at muzzle-point did they abandon their militant intentions. No doubt they had suffered severely and had had the Germans earmarked for retribution when the time was propitious. Apart from black eyes and kicked backsides, the thirty-odd prisoners that 10 Platoon had taken were evacuated back to the beach ... The inhabitants of Bayeux turned out en bloc. Our spirits rose and the Calvados [apple brandy] flowed freely. Scenes of exuberance and wild delight gave way to street dancing and singing as the news of the enemy withdrawal became more widely known."

Finally, we would like to pay tribute to the memory of Derek Rowe, who sadly passed away in August, aged 96. The Rowe family have been associated with Willand since the 1820s, as butchers and farmers, and in particular with The Elms in the Old Village – from where Derek and wife, Bernice, moved into Elmscroft next door, the house he had built on retirement from farming. Like generations of his family before him, Derek was at the heart of village life, with particular close associations with St Mary's Church, where he served many years as church warden. He was a keen sportsman, playing football for Willand Rovers, playing cricket for Cullompton, regularly playing skittles and more latterly, with Bernice, a founder member of Willand Short Mat Bowls Club.

Many of us who grew up in the village will have fond memories of Derek, whether happily stopping for a chat when passing by on his tractor, or on hot summer days letting children from the village in to use the swimming pool at the back of The Elms. Ever since the History Group was formed, back in 2001, Derek was always at hand with information about Willand's past, generously supporting our events, freely sharing memories, and loaning us precious family photos and archives for research and display at our exhibitions.

One story Derek told us not so long ago concerns an evening of sketches that was being put on at the Village Hall to raise money for a parish cause, probably in the 1960s. Derek was involved in a comedy sketch with John Spearing and Bob Salter, which involved the three of them sat on a bench, with sequences of them getting up and down, and one or other of them falling off to great comic timing, leaving the audience in fits of laughter. However, as they were due to be on in the second half, Bob Salter had brought along a bottle of whiskey. This they enjoyed as they awaited their turn. By the half time interval, the whiskey was gone, so Bob sent Derek and John staggering up to the Halfway House to get another bottle. Despite this, and their somewhat merry condition, the sketch seemed to go down very well. But later on, when getting back to the farm, Derek discovered that one of his cows was going through a difficult labour, and so, a little worse for wear, he got stuck in to help Harold Saunders, his farm worker, with the successful delivery of a newborn calf. After that Harold had to put him to bed. Derek was a cheerful, kind and generous man, dedicated to his family and community, and will be much missed. The king did not want a cringing subject but a lover, an equal, someone who loved him freely. He knew there was only one way to bridge the immeasurable gulf and win her genuine love. He must set aside his royal robes for the clothes of a peasant. He must give up his palace and throne for the dirty streets and drafty houses of the village. He must surrender being waited on hand and foot and the never-ending sumptuous food, to embrace poverty and hard labour. In short, he must fully enter her world and meet her there. So, that is what the king did. He walked the roads. He tilled the fields. And later on, with calloused hands, still wearing tattered clothing, he met her in the marketplace and introduced himself. Then he wooed and won the heart of the servant girl. On their wedding day he whispered in her ear, "my dear, now you are a gueen" They wed in royal splendour and lived happily ever after

Kierkegaard's fairy tale draws out one of the crowning truths of Christianity. John chapter 1 is a key Bible passage we read at Christmas. Here are some of the verses, "The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognise him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God"

At Christmas, we remember that God has bridged the immeasurable gulf between heaven and earth. He left his heavenly splendour. He entered into our world. He has become one of us. He has stepped into the marketplace to win our hearts and bring us back to God. Christmas is the beginning of God's big invitation! We are encouraged to look hard at the baby in the manger, and then to follow the story of Jesus through to its wonderful conclusion. To recognise that he is the king of heaven who gives up everything, including his life, to win our hearts. 


